




Netball to move to Step 4 of the Roadmap

Thank you to everyone for your support in helping netball get back on court!

With the changing government restrictions, the Netball Family can now look forward to netball activity with fewer restrictions.

So, to enable the game on court to return to normal whilst still reducing the risk of transmission, we will leave in place some of the off court risk mitigations, for example sanitisation protocols.

Please keep up to date on the latest guidance - *Managing Covid-19 within Netball* here.



Due to the continued prevalence of COVID-19, netball organisations must continue to complete the following actions before any netball activities:

- Complete a risk assessment and risk mitigation plan for each specific activity/venue. This must reference the ways in which COVID-19 will be managed.
- Appoint a COVID-19 Officer, or a lead who oversees the management of COVID-19, who should familiarise themselves with this guidance. For member organisations of England Netball, these individuals will continue to be supported with enhanced communications, resources and tools.
- Consider the fitness levels of players (at all levels). With many players having had months away from court, care and attention should be given to a careful and progressive return to minimise the risk of injury. Time must be allowed for all players to complete a full warm up and cool down before and after every netball activity.
- Whave in place clear communications with those involved in netball activity to ensure they understand the guidance, particularly around isolation and symptoms of COVID-19.
- Continue to report to covid@englandnetball.co.uk when multiple cases (2 or more) arise in a single club, team, match or session within a 14 day period. This is so we can monitor the spread of COVID-19 and support when necessary

Memberships and getting ENgage ready for the new season

Following the email to golden role committee club volunteers on 2nd August, here is a reminder to clubs to check your Engage details before the start of the new membership year:

1. Is your club's address up-to-date in England Netball's online portal, ENgage?

Here's how to check

This should be an address that your club is happy to publish publicly in England Netball's Club Finder e.g. your club's main training venue

2. Are your club's bank details present and correct in England Netball's online portal, ENgage?

Here's how to check

These need to be present in ENgage even if you are collecting club fees independently

3. Do you need to register an additional County Netball Association this year?

Here's how to check the County Netball Association/s that your club is currently registered with

You can do this if one or more of your teams plans to compete in a tournament registered to a secondary county in order to comply with league regulations

4. Are you planning to make any adjustments to your membership schemes in 2021/22?

Here's how to check your club's current membership schemes


